The Vision

For the Gospel. For Generations.

Before Jesus ascended into heaven, He gave His church a mission. *“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”* (Acts 1:8). From that moment until today, God's design has been for the Gospel to multiply through His church.

MULTIPLY is a vision to expand North Shelby Baptist Church's capacity for Gospel ministry—creating greater opportunities for people to worship Christ, grow as disciples, build meaningful relationships, and be sent to make disciples.

We are preparing not only for the needs of today, but for the opportunities of tomorrow—for people we have not yet met and generations who will hear the Gospel long after us.

The facilities are the tool. Gospel multiplication is the mission.

It started with a vision

For the Gospel. For Generations.

Our story has always been about preparing for what God would do next—creating capacity so more lives can be transformed by the Gospel.

In 1993, several couples in a Bible study received a vision from God to begin a new church. A church that would emphasize God's Word, caring for people, and sharing the Gospel beyond its own walls.

It all began with 42 people gathered in a basement. By the very next Sunday they had a space rented at the Valleydale Village Shopping Center. Their vision quickly came to life before them as walls were built, rooms were painted, and spaces were prepared for worship and Sunday School. New believers were baptized wherever water was available—in swimming pools, borrowed baptistries, and eventually a baptistry donated to the church.

The setting was humble, but God was at work. People were finding Christ, disciples were growing, and a church family was taking root.

As North Shelby grew, so did the need for space. First, the church assumed the property of Shady Grove Missionary Baptist Church. As they grew, they added onto that facility which is on HWY 41. Soon, this facility was no longer adequate. After years of prayer and perseverance, the church secured its Highway 280 property in 1999 and moved onto the new campus the following year. The education building followed in 2004, expanding opportunities for discipleship, children's ministry, worship, fellowship, and more.

Then, in 2013, North Shelby purchased 13.5 adjoining acres for future expansion. No one knew exactly when the land would be needed or what the future would hold.

They simply chose to be ready for what God might do next. Looking back, every step of faith created opportunities for ministry that previous generations could never have imagined.

“We didn't dream big enough.”

Years later, as one longtime member reflected on everything God had done through North Shelby, they said something simple: “We didn't dream big enough.”

Not because the dreams of those early members were too small, but because God's faithfulness was greater than they could see.

When they gathered in a basement, they could not see the families who would one day call North Shelby home. When they worshiped in rented space, sometimes with the sounds and aromas of a neighboring restaurant drifting into the service, they could not imagine the generations of children who would one day learn God's Word in classrooms of their own. And when new believers were baptized wherever water was available, they could not know how many others would follow.

They could not see us.

Today, we stand where they once stood, looking toward a future we cannot fully see. We do not know every family God will bring, every child who will grow in faith here, every disciple who will be made, or who may one day carry the Gospel across the world.

We cannot see the whole story.

We are simply being asked to be faithful with our part in it.

After constituting on Nov 20, 1993, and worshipping in a member's basement on the 22nd, a storefront space is rented and the congregation begins meeting in the Valleydale Village Shopping Center the following Sunday morning.

NSBC joins the Shelby Baptist Association and becomes the only baptist church located on the 280 corridor when it relocates to the location of the former Shady Grove Missionary Baptist Church on Hwy 41.



The sanctuary's current location is secured in the fall. The congregation celebrates their first worship service in just over a year after groundbreaking. North Shelby finally has a permanent location.

NSBC is given the opportunity to purchase 13.5 acres connecting to the Narrows community, a visionary move pursued by Pastor Murphy and church leadership that sets the stage for our current opportunities.



Construction for the Education Center begins. The church offices, fellowship hall, children's and youth areas and so much more would be located in this connected location.

Living in the Fruit of Their Faithfulness

Every Sunday, we see the story continuing—in children opening their Bibles, students asking questions about faith, families finding community, believers being baptized, disciples growing, people serving, and others answering the call to go. These moments may seem ordinary as they happen, but together they tell a much larger story of God at work through His church.

The ministry we experience today did not begin with us, but the responsibility to carry it forward now belongs to us. **MULTIPLY** is our opportunity to participate in God's work through intentional disciple-making, extravagant generosity, and greater capacity for Gospel ministry.

God multiplies the Gospel. Our desire is to faithfully participate in what He is doing. **We are living on the sacrifice of others before us.** The classrooms our children occupy... The sanctuary where we worship... The parking lot we walk across...

Others before us prayed. Others before us gave. Others before us believed God could do it.

Now it's our turn.

Making Room for the Mission

God has graciously blessed North Shelby with growth. As our church family has grown, we've also begun to experience the limitations of our current facilities. More people means more opportunities for worship, more children learning God's Word, more discipleship groups gathering, and more ministry taking place. Rather than allowing our space to limit our mission, we believe God is calling us to expand our capacity for what He is already doing.

The facilities serve the mission.

A building cannot share the Gospel, a room cannot make a disciple, and a sanctuary cannot change a heart. Only Jesus can do that. Yet throughout North Shelby's history, God has used physical spaces to create opportunities for ministry. A basement began as a gathering place, a shopping center became a place for worship and discipleship, and each expansion that followed allowed the ministry of the church to grow.

Today, we believe it is time to expand our capacity once again. Not simply to create more space but keep that same vision that became in 1993. The vision has not changed, nor has the mission that God has entrusted to us. We want to create greater opportunities for people to worship and hear God's Word, for children, students, and adults to grow as faithful disciples, for relationships to deepen and ministry to flourish, and for people to be equipped and sent with the Gospel. We are not simply adding space. We are expanding our capacity for ministry.

The vision includes a new sanctuary, a new Commons, additional classrooms, and strategic renovations to our existing building. Each space has a purpose: to strengthen the ministry of North Shelby today while creating capacity for the opportunities ahead.

The Gospel moves from person to person and generation to generation. Someone shared it with us, prayed for us, taught us, and invested in our lives. Now, we have the privilege of carrying it forward—across the street, throughout our community, and around the world. From the beginning, North Shelby has embraced a mission of both giving and going, and that calling continues today.

That same mission is taking shape in the generations growing up among us. Every week, children and students are learning God's Word, asking questions, building relationships, and discovering what it means to follow Jesus. Our prayer is that they will become faithful disciples who carry the Gospel wherever God leads them.

This is how the Gospel multiplies: lives changed by Jesus, disciples making disciples, and one generation faithfully carrying the Good News to the next. Just as the Gospel moved outward from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth, our prayer is that God would continue multiplying the Gospel through North Shelby Baptist Church for generations to come.

The opportunity is before us.

Today, North Shelby has the opportunity to invest in the next chapter of Gospel ministry.

Through MULTIPLY, our goal is to raise:

\$8 MILLION

toward a new sanctuary, commons, additional classrooms, and strategic renovations to our existing campus.

But the true measure of this vision will never be found in dollars or square feet. It will be seen in lives changed by the Gospel, disciples growing in faith, relationships strengthened, families finding community, and people equipped and sent to make disciples.

We are not asking our church family to fund a construction project. We are inviting our church family to invest in generations of Gospel ministry. Our goal is not simply to build something larger. It is to prepare faithfully for the ministry God places before us, and to believe He could do more that we could even dream.

OUR Response

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Our response begins with prayer and trust. Each of us has been given different resources and opportunities, and no two stories of generosity will look the same. What matters is that we seek God faithfully and respond as He leads, trusting that together, our individual acts of faithfulness can accomplish far more than any of us could do alone.

We began this journey by asking,

“What if?”

As we enter these 21 days of prayer, we now ask the question only God can answer:

Lord, what would You have me do?

One day, someone will walk into North Shelby Baptist Church for the very first time.

A child will hear about Jesus.

A student will surrender to ministry.

A marriage will be restored.

A missionary will be sent.

A family will find hope.

None of them will know your name but they will experience the fruit of your generosity. Just as we are living in the generosity of those who came before us, future generations will one day live in the fruit of ours.

Those before us were faithful with their moment.

Now, this moment is ours.

21 DAYS OF PRAYER

For the Gospel. For Generations.

As our church enters this 21 Days of Prayer, are you ready to pray? The Bible says, "*Search me, O God, and know my heart. Test me, and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends You, and lead me along the path of everlasting life.*" Psalm 139: 22-23

You are ready to pray when you can truly answer yes to the following questions:

Are all sins confessed?

(Isa. 50: 1-2; Ps. 66:18; 1 John 1:10)

Are all relationships with others made right?

(Matt 6: 14-15)

Are you seeking God's will in all things?

(1 John 5: 14-15)

Are you seeking to glorify God above all things?

(John 14: 13-14)

Are you depending on the Holy Spirit's guidance?

(Rom 8:26-27)

Are you trusting God in spite of what seems to be?

(Prov 3:5-6)

Will you praise God no matter what?

(1 The 5: 16-18)

The great prayer warrior, Andrew Murray, wrote "Little of the Word with little prayer is death to the spiritual life. Much of the Word with little prayer gives a sickly life. Much prayer with little of the Word gives more life, but without steadfastness. A full measure of the Word and prayer each day gives a healthy and powerful life."

In his classic work, "With Christ in the School of Prayer, Andrew Murray pointedly writes, "Moses never gave a command or regulation with regard to prayer; even the prophets say little directly about the duty of prayer. It is Christ who teaches us to pray." The fact that Jesus is our tutor and example in all things is nowhere more clear than in our prayer life. Jesus never taught His disciples how to preach, only how to pray. Jesus did not speak much of what was needed to preach well, but much of praying well. To know how to speak to God is more important than knowing how to speak with men, but power with God is the first thing. Jesus loves to teach us how to pray."

I frequently joined these men in prayer in the woods near our home. We would meet at a "Rock Altar." Each time we met to pray, each person would place a new rock on the altar. They taught me that praying God's Word was how I would learn to live my life for the glory of God. They encouraged me to have a daily "Quiet Time" every morning before breakfast to pray and read the Bible.

2 Peter 1: 2-4 states, "Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord, as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, by which have been given to us exceeding great and precious promises, and through these you may be partakers of the divines nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." How do we access God's exceeding great and precious promises to become partakers of His divine nature? By praying God's Word!

The following "Warriors Prayer" (Eph 6: 10-17) is an outstanding example of praying God's Word! The precision of this prayer will help you to put on each piece of spiritual armor with purpose and to start each day in communion with God. When we remain persistent and focused in prayer, our eyes begin to open to the power of Christ in our lives, and we become armed for victory!

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."

As you walk through this 21-day prayer devotional guide, please hear the heart and prayers of the individuals who wrote the daily devotionals and pray surrendering your will to God's perfect will for your life. Remember the words of Christ! "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you." (Matt 6:33)

I love you in the Lord and pray that you are daily surrendering your will to God's will! It is in God's will that we find peace and wisdom to know the right thing to do.

Have you ever wondered why God doesn't always answer our prayers when or how we want things to turn out? The story of how God placed Hannah in our family is proof of our amazing God working things out in His perfect timing. In the fall of 2022, I remember asking God what He wanted to do with my life, and I told Him I was at peace with whatever plan He had but the desire of my heart was to be a mother.

I had prayed similar prayers over the years, but in hindsight God's silence was refining Steven and I to seek His will and to be at peace with Him being in control. Little did I know as I prayed that fall day that God was finally going to answer our prayers. We don't always get to see the fruit of our prayers, but after Hannah was born, God allowed us to see how He was at work through prayer. Have you ever felt a nudging to randomly pray for someone, or someone who you haven't seen or talked to in a long time pops into your head? Be assured that it isn't random, but rather the work of the Holy Spirit to pray for that person.

This is just a small glimpse of some of the people we learned about after Hannah was born who felt led to pray for Steven and me. A few weeks after my prayer in the fall of 2022, a friend from church called Steven and "randomly" asked if we had ever wanted children and that he felt led to pray for us about that. A friend who had recently memorized the entire book of Galatians felt led to pray Galatians 4 over me as she would recite it. Another friend from church felt led to pray for me and Steven every day on the way to work as she passed by the road that leads to our house. A friend who I had recently reconnected with, felt led to pray for me around the time Hannah was born. All of these were silent prayers, but God was still working out His plan for Hannah to be a part of our lives through adoption. Even though you may not see the fruit of your prayers, be faithful in prayer knowing that God will answer in His perfect timing and His will which are all ultimately for His glory!

North Shelby Baptist Church, A Shining Light on a Hill

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden."

MATTHEW 5:14

Cindy and I have gone through two major church construction projects. The first, at our home church when we were kids... a new sanctuary and educational building. The second, at our last church, when we were in our 30's. The result of both building campaigns was the salvation of and spiritual growth of countless individuals, and the calling out to full-time ministry of nearly 20+ individuals. And specifically, for ourselves, words cannot begin to describe the Bible learning and spiritual growth that came to us and our children because of having those projects completed years ago. We certainly had those learned and spiritual individuals that taught us, but the teaching that was done was certainly enhanced because there was ample space and physical facilities in which to learn and grow.

As North Shelby embarks upon a Capital Campaign for building a new sanctuary, considerable thought and prayer are needed! Building a \$12+ million sanctuary complex is important and is needed in our community. We are reminded in Ezra and Nehemiah of the importance of rebuilding the wall surrounding Jerusalem, and the rebuilding of that city. It represented more than just a "wall" around a city. It represented identity... identity of God and His purposes.

The same here for North Shelby. Construction of a larger sanctuary is not just the construction of a larger "auditorium", but it represents an identity of God's purposes for North Shelby as it sits on top of this hill... as a beacon and shining light of God's glorious redemptive plan of salvation to all. There are many prayers written in the Bible. We are reminded of the prayer by Solomon, the asking for wisdom. But others, too, have asked for God's wisdom and guidance regarding decisions that must be made. We find in Psalm 25:4-5 David's prayer for help and guidance, "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths; Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long." So we have a basis upon which to pray for wisdom and guidance from God.

But also, Paul prayed in Philippians 1: 9-11, "...it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent..." Thus, not only am I praying for myself to make MY right decision regarding the capital campaign (as David prayed for discernment for himself), but I would also pray for OTHERS (at North Shelby) to pray and make decisions that are "excellent" in the eyes of the Lord. Scripture is plain that we should pray for things for ourselves, but we should also pray for others. Prayer is powerful... and though some topics and actions in the life of our church community may not seem major to us, but to God... it is major. It is a big deal!

Therefore, we pray. We pray with all earnestness and honesty in our prayer. Do we really want that wisdom and discernment, or is our prayer just a vain voice, simply amplifying our own prejudice and desires? Serious prayer, honest and humble prayer before the Lord, can be powerful!

What North Shelby Baptist Church Means to Us

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose."

ROMANS 8:28

We began attending North Shelby in 2015, after our youngest son went off to college. Before this we had gone to a small Baptist church in Childersburg, mainly for our youngest son, due to the youth group which consisted of his high school friends. So many of the youth graduated the year Logan did, and we found ourselves yearning for something different with more opportunities to learn and serve. We began to visit several churches in our little town and spread out from there. I might mention we are not from Childersburg, but rather "transplants", moving there when our son was a junior. We continued to pray and seek where the Lord would lead us.

One of Logan's soccer teammates from Coosa Valley was killed during a burglary while he was attending college less than a year after high school graduation. This young man had family who attended North Shelby. We went to his memorial service and were very impressed with the care and compassion shown toward that family. A short time later, we visited there and got to meet the pastor, Allan Murphy. What a great godly pastor, who never forgot a face and who truly loved people. This was the beginning of a precious friendship with Brother Allan and his wife, Mary. We began attending North Shelby.

I was working during all this time as a nurse, first for St. Vincent's and then as a traveling nurse. Mark worked for the paper mill. During my 4 years of traveling, I was staying away, out of state, for months at a time. I would always visit churches while away on my Sundays off. Even traveling, I found opportunities to serve at North Shelby. In 2018 and 2019 I went with North Shelby to New York City as a part of SpreadTruth, a multi-church evangelistic outreach ministry to the people of the Big Apple. So many lost souls and so many hungry to hear the gospel! The first year I went, my bed mate (4 women to a room with 2 queen beds!) was Kelly Gilliland. One of the things we talked about was our experience with special needs members of our family. We had a grandson, 4 years old at the time, who was autistic. He was our first and he was so special to us! Kelly and I talked a lot about our hopes and concerns for them. Then, on October 5, 2018, a few short months later, we had tragic news. Our precious Stephen had drowned in his great grandmother's pool. You can only imagine our grief and shock. I shared the news with my good friend and Sunday School teacher at the time, Marsha, asking for prayer. We were put on the church's prayer list - so many phone calls, cards, people sharing their own stories. We felt the church wrapped their arms around us during this time. So many special people were there for us.

During Covid I worked in an ICU Covid Unit. I had other nurse friends at North Shelby, and many prayers went up for the patients and healthcare workers. A crazy time where so many lost their lives yet so many sailed through - our lives and liberties were changed. One ministry I was able to do shortly before and during this time centered around teaching at North Shelby's School for Performing Arts, a community outreach program. I had prayed for a way for the Lord to use my musical background, and the church advertised for teachers. It was an answer to prayer! Those 1-1/2 years of working with my 6 students, the relationships built and the gospel conversations were very meaningful.

Other things that have encouraged Mark and I in our spiritual walk and relationships with the body of believers at North Shelby Baptist Church has been our Sunday School teachers who go above and beyond – Marsha Coggins, Mary Murphy, Wendell Sheffield, and a big shout to our current teacher, Joey Carter, who puts so much into our lessons and discussions! We have also been blessed with opportunities to serve on mission trips with Builders for Christ and one trip to Curacao (Mark). I have served on the Missions Committee, and it has really opened my eyes to all the needs and opportunities for gospel ministry in our area and around the world. And our pastor has such a heart for sharing the gospel, church growth and planting. Mark and I feel the Lord is doing great things in the life and ministries of our church, and we look forward to seeing what will be in the days ahead!

We came to North Shelby shortly before the move to this location, in search of a church with a traditional style of worship. We found a family of Bible believers committed to missions, full of faithful prayer warriors.

Two distinct times, we have been faced with challenges that were potentially life threatening and seemed insurmountable. In 2009, Patti got an infection and became septic. She was placed on a ventilator and remained on it for 23 days. During that time, she experienced two episodes that looked like she might not survive. Both times, the members of North Shelby and other faithful believers rallied around us and prayed that God would protect her and bring her through safely, and He did. God answered those prayers allowed her to make a full recovery.

In 2023, doctors found a large mass in my liver, which turned out to be bile duct cancer. The oncologist made it clear that this type of cancer was treatable with chemotherapy, immunotherapy, and radiation, but could only be cured by surgical removal of the tumor. At the time, the surgical oncologist said that the tumor was too large to remove. It could only be removed if they could get it to shrink a great deal, and it was in the right position for safe removal. The process was slow and required different therapies, but we kept praying, along with our church family and friends that God would shrink the tumor and allow it to be removed. Again, God blessed us and answered our prayers. The surgeon was able to successfully remove all the cancer.

God has greatly blessed us with these two miracles and the support of a wonderful church family. Without that friendship and prayer support, we would have felt so alone.

We don't have a large family, so this church family has meant so much to us over the years. Your prayers, presence during surgery, and genuine care mean more to us than you can know.

In 2019 North Shelby started a discipleship program on Sunday nights using the book Foundations, A 260 Day Bible Reading Plan for Busy Believers. I was a believer and I was definitely busy, so I joined a small group. This reading plan was different from other "read the Bible in a year" plans where you read a chapter or two and then check off a box. In the F260 workbook, we used the acronym HEAR. HEAR stands for highlight, explain, apply and respond. The purpose was to read in order to understand and respond to God's Word daily. Each of these steps was to create an atmosphere to hear God speak.

Up until this time, my Bible reading consisted of the Bible studies I was doing. I read about the faith of the patriarchs, the heart of David, the courage of Esther, stepping up in the Psalms and even how to believe God. They were great Bible studies, but when you start reading the Bible every day you see how all these "stories" come together to give us the big picture of God's story. The Bible is God's revelation of Himself to the world. In it we find the way to salvation and sanctification. Reading God's Word every day changed me! I can say, too, with the psalmist, "if your law had not been my delight, I would have perished in my affliction." (Psalm 119:92) God knew in His sovereignty that I would need His word to sustain me in the coming years through some tough challenges. He did not fail to keep His promises.

A former pastor of mine once said we should ask ourselves frequently if we can see spiritual growth in our lives. If you are not growing, try changing your fertilizer to reading God's word every day. You'll bloom. After all, our purpose is to shine so others see Jesus.

One of the tasks assigned to our recent Alaska mission team was organizing a large children's resource room at the church where we were staying. One clue to how long it had been since the room had been used was the stack of old dot matrix printing paper we discovered. While we were working at the church, most of the men were busy with a construction project that turned out to be more involved than expected. Even so, they accomplished a great deal, bringing two apartments much closer to being ready to house individuals and families in need, located next to the church we were there to support. For the remainder of the week, in addition to the ongoing construction work, many of us served at a free vision clinic held at a nearby community center. One of our team members had the idea of bringing the old dot matrix paper from the church for the children to draw on while they waited for their parents. That simple idea worked beautifully and led to us taking colorful paper, coloring books and crayons on later days, giving the children fun activities and creating opportunities to connect with their families. Many meaningful conversations arose to encourage people, and prayers were had with those who came for eye exams as well as those waiting on them.

What we hadn't expected was to discover that Anchorage is such a melting pot of nationalities, with people from around the world calling it home. God gave us opportunities to demonstrate the love of Christ to those who came, regardless of language or cultural barriers. Watching our team – people of different ages, personalities and gifts – serve, pray, laugh, adapt, eat, rest and worship together was inspiring. We went to Alaska hoping to be a blessing to others, but we returned having received an even greater blessing ourselves. Missions has been part of North Shelby Baptist's DNA since the church began. Whether serving locally through the Shelby Baptist Association, participating in mission trips across the US and around the world, or sharing the Gospel through Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, we have sought to fulfill Christ's command to take the Good News to all people. In God's hands, even outdated dot matrix printer paper became a tool for ministry. Whatever unique gifts, talents and opportunities God has given to you, be intentional about using them for His glory. Even if your contribution seems small or ordinary, God delights in using faithful obedience to accomplish extraordinary things that reveals the love of Christ to others.

Whatever You Ask, Lord

"Speak, for your servant hears."

1 SAMUEL 3:10

For the last 21 days, we have prayed together. We have remembered the stories God's faithfulness to this church. We have thanked Him for and honored those who came before us and sacrificed. We have prayed for our church, our community, our children, our grandchildren, and for people whose names we do not yet know.

And now we are left with one question:

Lord, what would You have me do?

Are we ready to listen to what God might say to us through that question?

As we ask this, I am reminded of the story of the Old Testament prophet, Samuel. When God was calling out to him, Samuel finally realized it was the Lord who was calling him in the night. His response was simple but profound: "Speak, for your servant hears."

In other words, Lord, I'm listening. Whatever You say, I am Yours. My life, everything I have, is a blank check for you. **What will you have me do?**

That is the posture I pray we have today collectively as a church.

After 21 days of prayer, the most important thing is not the number written on your commitment card. The most important thing is whether you have genuinely come before the Lord and said, "Speak, Lord. I am listening. What do you want me to do?"

God has blessed each of us differently. We cannot all give equal gifts, but we can all make equal sacrifices. Faithfulness will look different in every home. But it will take all of us together to accomplish what is before us. We should never wonder, "What is everyone else doing?" All that really matter is, "Lord, what are You asking of me?"

Thirty-three years ago, a small group of people could not have imagined everything God would do through North Shelby Baptist Church. They could not see us. They did not know our names. They could not picture the children who would fill these hallways, the missionaries who would be sent, the believers who would be baptized, or the families who would find a church home here.

They simply had their moment to be faithful. It came at great costs and sacrifice. It took a step of faith believing that God would do something they could not see. However, if God was calling them, then it would be worth it. It is now our moment to be faithful.

If the Lord tarries, another generation will worship here. Children who have not yet been born will hear the Gospel. People we have never met will walk through these doors. Some will come carrying broken hearts. Some will come searching for answers. Some will hear about Jesus and believe. Some may be called from this church to carry the Gospel to the nations.

They may never know our names, but this was never about making our names known. It is about making the name of Jesus known. Every generation before us at North Shelby has left this church better than they found it. Now it's our turn. Is the Lord asking us to invest our time, talents, and treasures so future generations can know Jesus and the blessing of this church like we do?

Speak, Lord. Your servants are listening.

And whatever You ask of us, give us the faith to say yes.
